### **Age Requirements**

Senior Games events are open to all men and women age 50 and older by June 1, 2024. Age categories vary with each event.

### **Entry Fees**

- \$1 per event (\$2 after June 1)
- Official Senior Games t-shirt: \$8 (free with 6 or more events)
- Awards Banquet: \$5 for participants / \$10 for guest

### To Register (Beginning May 6)

Complete the entry form and return it with payment to: Community Center, 233 W. Main St., Fort Wayne, IN 46802

Registrations must be received by 4:00 p.m. Friday, May 31 to qualify for the registration fee of \$1 per event. Late registrations will be accepted until 12:00 p.m. two business days prior to an event or Friday at 12:00 p.m. for Monday events. All registrations received after June 1 will be charged \$2 per event. Community Center hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

#### **Event Cancellations**

The Senior Games committee reserves the right to modify rules and formats or to cancel specific events due to insufficient entries or other extenuating circumstances. Age categories with fewer than 5 participants will be combined with another age category.

#### **Inclement Weather**

Outdoor events will be held, rain or shine, if possible. If an event must be cancelled due to weather, every attempt will be made to reschedule. Entry fees will not be refunded.

### **Unsportsmanlike Behavior**

Any participant who uses profanity or causes disruption of an event will be disqualified from that event. If the behavior persists, the participant will be removed from the Games.

The undersigned executes this RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT RELATING TO NOVEL CORONA VIRUS/COVID-19 (COVID-19 RELEASE) and this GENERAL RELEASE RELATING TO PARK ACTIVITIES AND PRESENCE AT PARK FACILITIES (GENERAL RELEASE).

In executing this COVID-19 RELEASE and GENERAL RELEASE, I acknowledge, understand, covenant and agree as follows:

- I. I represent that I have the complete and unrestricted legal capacity and legal authority to execute this COVID Release and General Release.
- 2. I agree that I shall at all times follow the Guidelines when participating in the FWPRD Programs/Activities and when present in, on or about the FWRD Facilities. This includes the following Code of Conduct. Be considerate, kind, courteous and respectful to others. I agree to use courteous language at all times; racial remarks, swearing, malicious gossip and sexual harassment will not be tolerated. I will show proper care and respect for the property of FWPRD and others. I will maintain the standard dress and hygiene code. I understand that actions or behavior which violate the Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary actions that may include a written warning, suspension or removal from the facility.
- 3.
