SUMMARIZATION OF MINUTES FOR THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS

On **Thursday, April 10, 2025**, the Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation Department, along with the Board of Park Commissioners held their monthly Board meeting in the McMillen Family Pavilion, 1750 Goshen Avenue (Franke Park) Fort Wayne, IN 46808

- 1. <u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> Board President Justin Shurley called the monthly Board meeting to order at 10:00 am.
- 2. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>: Board President Shurley called for approval of the minutes from the Thursday, March 13, 2025, meeting. Commissioner Richard Briley moved, and Commissioner Jenna Jauch seconded the motion to approve the minutes. The motion was duly carried. On file are the monthly Board minutes.
- 3. <u>PAYROLL & COMMERCIAL VOUCHERS</u>: Deputy Director Rhonda Berg requested the Board's approval of payroll and commercial vouchers. Included in the report are the number of full-time and part-time employees, for pay periods ending 02/14/25 and 02/28/25, account payables payment vouchers #121 to #284, with a Payroll Sub-Total of \$952,806.18. <u>NOTED</u> were various Parks Capital projects. The totals are in the Park General Fund, Park Trust Fund, Park Non-Reverting Operating Fund, Park Non-Reverting Capital Fund, Park Cumulative Building Fund, and Other City Funds, for Account Payables Total of \$11,385,244.34 and a total of \$2,338,050.52. Commissioner Jenna Jauch moved, and Commissioner Richard Briley seconded the motion. The motion was duly carried. On file is the signed, recorded document and the February 2025 report.
- 4. **TRUST FUND DONATIONS:** Deputy Director Berg navigated the Board members through a listing of the donors, amounts, and purpose, along with donations, endowments, and grants for Riverfront IIB Sculpture, from the Public Art Commission, Foellinger-Freimann Botanical conservatory 2025 Butterfly Exhibit In memory of Jo Ann and

5. <u>NON-REVERTING FUNDS</u>: Deputy Director of Finance, Rhonda Berg, reported to the Board on the Non-Reverting Capital and Operating Fund Budgets, associated with each Deputy Director as assigned. Commissioner Jauch moved, and Commissioner Briley seconded the motion to approve the annual 2025 Non-Reverting Capital and Operating Fund Budgets. The motion was duly carried. On file are both the Non-Reverting Capital and Operating Fund Budgets.

6. <u>AGREEMENTS / FEES/ RESOLUTIONS / POLICY APPROVALS:</u>

<u>8200 North River Road Cash Agreement: Tom and Richard Hemsoth - Berg</u> Board Vice-President Miller moved and Commissioner Jauch seconded the motion to approve the Cash Rent Agreement, effective as of January 1, 2025, between the City of Fort Wayne, Indian Board of Park Commissioners/Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation Department (Owner) and Thomas J. Hemsoth and Richard J. Hemsoth (Tenants), about land located in the 8200 block of North River road, known as tract #13128 by the Farm Service Agency and contains 29.4 farmable acres. The motion was duly carried. Three original documents were submitted for signatures. On file is the signed by all necessary parties, Cash Rent Agreement, and the applicable map of the land.

7. <u>PARK PRIORITIES</u>: Deputy Director of Planning and Landscape, Chad Shaw, updated the Board on larger projects, including construction site issues, for the Riverfront Phase IIB, working through storm line challenges, and site work. Working with AEP to coordinate all necessary utility lines. Approximately 99.9% complete with the Franke Renaissance project. The Foster Park entrance project is moving along well, semi-development drawing will be forthcoming, with continued communication with the Public. Packard Park foundations for the pavilion have been poured, all the drainage work is set, and paths and concrete work should be visible in a few months. Brewer Park playground is ahead of schedule. At Lawton Park, the Pedestrian Bridge is near completion, with plans for a handful of trees to be planted later.

8. <u>BIDS / CONTRACT / CHANGE ORDER APPROVALS:</u>

<u>Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory elevator Project Change Order #1</u>– Shaw Commissioner Jauch moved and Commissioner Briley seconded the motion to approve an addition to the contract with American Elevator, Inc. Commissioner moved and Commissioner seconded the motion to approve. The motion was duly carried. On file is the original contract, the signed approval form, and the details for Change Order #1.
