Age Requirements

Senior Games events are open to all men and women age 50 and older by June 1, 2025. Age categories vary with each event.

Registrations received by 4:00 p.m. Friday, May 30 qualify for the registration fee of \$1 per event. Registrations received after May 30 will be charged \$2 per event. Registrations will be accepted as late as two business days prior to an event or Thursday at 12:00 p.m. for Monday events. Community Center hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

Event Cancellations

The Senior Games committee reserves the right to modify rules and formats, or to cancel specific events due to insufficient entries or other extenuating circumstances. Age categories with fewer than 4 participants will be combined with another age category.

Inclement Weather

Outdoor events will be held, rain or shine, if possible. If an event must be cancelled due to weather, every attempt will be made to reschedule. Entry fees will not be refunded.

Unsportsmanlike Behavior

Any participant who uses profanity or causes disruption of an event will be disqualified from that event. If the behavior persists, the participant will be removed from the Games.

Participants MUST report to the event coordinator prior to the posted check-in deadline for each event to allow for registration verification. Please plan to arrive early and allow time to check in. Those not verified by the deadline will be disqualified.



The undersigned executes this RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT and this GENERAL RELEASE RELATING TO PARK ACTIVITIES AND PRESENCE AT PARK FACILITIES (GENERAL RELEASE).

In executing this GENERAL RELEASE, I acknowledge, understand, covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. I represent that I have the complete and unrestricted legal capacity and legal authority to execute this General Release.
- 2. I agree that I shall at all times follow the Guidelines when participating in the FWPRD Programs/Activities and when present in, on or about the FWRD Facilities. This includes the following Code of Conduct. Be considerate, kind, courteous and respectful to others. I agree to use courteous language at all times; racial remarks, swearing, malicious gossip and sexual harassment will not be tolerated. I will show proper care and respect for the property of FWPRD and others. I will maintain the standard dress and hygiene code. I understand that actions or behavior which violate the Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary actions that may include a written warning, suspension or removal from the facility.
