Trail descriptions:

Each trail offers benches for resting and scenic footbridges. Other features include track boxes, bird feeders, a pavilion and tables for picnicking, water well pump and our fire circle.

Trillium Trail-

Named after our famous wildflower, the Trillium, this 0.5 mile trail offers a wide variety of beautiful wildflowers. Some of the flowers you'll see are the Wild Geranium, Spring Beauty, Jack in the Pulpit and of course, the Trillium.

Oak Paradise-

Winding through a grove of Oak trees, this trail has a more deep woods feeling. The trail itself is 0.75 miles and is home to our new bridge constructed by a group of boy scouts to achieve their Eagle Scout honors.

Trail Of Reflection-

The pride and joy of Lindenwood Nature Preserve is our Trail Of Reflection. This 1.0 mile long trail is wheel chair and stroller accessible. Hiking on this trail leads you over three boardwalks which enter into on of our main attractions, the pond. Our pond is a wonderful place to relax and walk out on to the dock. Further down the trail is the option of taking the Maple spur trail or continuing on the Trail Of Reflection back to the fire circle.

Maple spur-

This short trail of .25 miles offers an alternative ending to the Trail Of Reflection. It winds through a small maple grove and gives entrance to Chickadee Crossing.
